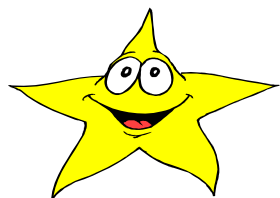




Inglewood Community Nursery and Infant School- Behaviour Contract 2016-2017

<p>We will praise positive behaviour and incorporate praise into the daily routine. Praise reinforces positive behaviour and self-esteem in children. To encourage good behaviour and positive self-esteem we actively praise and reward kind, generous and considerate behaviour. We incorporate this into the daily routine through verbal praise, stickers and special work assemblies.</p>	<p>The Golden Rules are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Follow Instructions• Keep your hands and feet to yourself• Speak politely and respectfully to everyone• Ask permission to leave the classroom	<p>Breaking any of the above rules, will have sanctions as below:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Verbal warning2. White Card3. Yellow card and 5 minutes time out4. Red card and 10 minutes time out5. Close supervision the following day and a letter to parents with return slip
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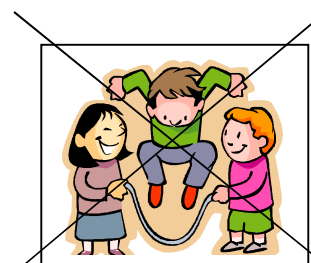
White Card

The parent/carer of a child who is in Close Supervision three times during a half term, will receive a letter inviting them to a formal meeting with the class teacher and Year Group Leader/Headteacher to discuss the behaviour. A Home School Diary for behaviour will be organised.

Any rule breaking in the playground or at dinnertimes is recorded by the supervising adult in a year group book, which is handed to the class teacher at the end of break and forms part of your child's behaviour record.

Nursery need only apply the first two rules and will not be involved in Close Supervision. Behaviour will be managed within the classroom, with the addition of a book to record incidents during outside play.
